There are lawned areas, well-kept borders with hardy perennials, mature trees and shrubs to enjoy. It's also accessible for anyone with limited mobility. Just the place to sit and enjoy coffee, cake and a chat. Parking should be OK but more on that later on. The cost for coffee or tea, home-made cakes and biscuits throughout the morning is **£5**. THURSDAY 30 JUNE Outing to Fullers Mill Garden, West Stowe, Bury St. Edmunds

The coach departs Royal Square at 9.30 am and will take us to “a waterside gem in the heart of Suffolk”

This is a 7-acre *Perennial Garden* for year-round interest. As they say ... “You can explore the magical gardens around the Mill Pond which is planted with massed primulas, the majestic displays of lilies in the Top Garden, the Strip with its bed of sun-loving plants and views across the lake. Then there's the Low Garden where the mix of shady areas and sunny glades offer ideal conditions for a whole range of charming woodland plants”. If you Google ‘Fullers Mill Garden’ you will find various websites giving more information, the history of the garden and lots of pictures.

We have been able to negotiate an all-in price of £28 for members and £30 for guests. Although this is slightly more than usual you will get a lot for your money: coach fare, tea/coffee on arrival, entry to the garden with a guided tour from the Head Gardener and a two-course **buffet lunch**. [*Provision will be made for vegetarians and those needing gluten free.*] Refreshments can be purchased in their café and plants propagated from the garden are also available.

We hope to leave there at around **4 pm**; see also our own website for the full itinerary.

Tickets will be available from **6 April** and at **all** the above events but they **MUST be purchased in advance from Colin Biggins (323565)**. The last date for buying your ticket will be **16 June** when we have to let the Mill know how many people to expect.
